Property Overview

Buck Creek Hunting Property is located in Macon County, Georgia—one of the top trophy buck counties in the state. According to Georgia Outdoor News (GON), Macon County consistently ranks among the top five counties for producing mature whitetail bucks.

The property features a small duck pond perfect for hunting wood ducks, along with the diverse habitat needed to grow and hold quality deer. Buck Creek flows through the tract, providing a year-round water source for wildlife. The creek also creates ideal bedding and travel corridors for deer, feeding areas for ducks during the acorn drop, and even a spot to catch fish.

The land is currently planted in two age classes of timber: 6 acres of 9-year-old loblolly pine and 40 acres of 4-year-old longleaf pine. The longleaf stand offers future income potential through pine straw leasing in the next 5 to 6 years. In addition, 7 acres of mature hardwoods supply hard mast for deer and roosting trees for turkeys.

Located just 10 minutes from Ellaville, 25 minutes from Americus, and 45 minutes from Perry, this property offers exceptional recreational value in one of Georgia's most renowned big buck counties.






